National Curriculum Objectives:

English Year 5: (5G4.1b) Using the perfect form of verbs to mark relationships of time and cause

Differentiation:

Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Identify the odd one out using the present tense forms: simple present and present progressive where there are no changes to the base verb. Uses single-clause sentences.

Expected Identify the odd one out using the present tense forms: simple present and present progressive where there are changes to the base verb. Uses multi-clause sentences with co-ordination.

Greater Depth Identify the odd one out using the present tense forms: simple present and present progressive. Includes contractions and negative verb forms, where there are changes to the base verb. Uses multi-clause sentences with subordination.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Identify whether the statement is true or false using the present tense forms: simple present and present progressive where there are no changes to the base verb. Uses single-clause sentences.

Expected Identify whether the statement is true or false using the present tense forms: simple present and present perfect where there are changes to the base verb. Uses multi-clause sentences with co-ordination.

Greater Depth Identify whether the statement is true or false using the present tense forms: simple present, present progressive and present perfect. Includes contractions and negative verb forms, where there are changes to the base verb. Uses multi-clause sentences with subordination.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application and Reasoning)

Developing Decide which statement is correct using understanding of the present perfect tense where there are no changes to the base verb. Uses single-clause sentences.

Expected Decide which statement is correct using understanding of the simple present tense where there are changes to the base verb. Uses multi-clause sentences with co-ordination.

Greater Depth Decide which statement is correct using understanding of using understanding of the present perfect tense. Includes contractions and negative verb forms, where there are changes to the base verb. Uses multi-clause sentences with subordination.

Present Tense

Developing

1. Sentence A is the odd one out as it is written in the simple present tense. Sentences B and C are written in the present progressive tense.
2. False. Sentence B is written in the simple present tense.
3. Bartie is correct because his sentence uses 'has' and the past tense verb 'melted'. Fariah has used the present progressive tense.

Expected

4. Sentence B is the odd one out as it uses the present progressive tense. Sentences A and C are written in the simple present tense.
5. False. Sentence B is written in the simple present tense.
6. Adrienne is correct because she has used the simple present verbs 'goes' and 'purchases'. Vance has used the present progressive tense.

Greater Depth

7. Sentence A is the odd one out as it is written in the present progressive tense. Sentences B and C are written in the simple present tense.
8. False. Sentence A has also used the present progressive tense and C is written in the simple present tense.
9. Imelda is correct because she has used 'have' which is in the present tense and the past tense verbs 'slept' and 'had'. Rafael has written his sentence in the simple present tense.
