Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Match each word to the correct synonym. Using vocabulary from the Y3/4 Spelling List.

Expected Match each word to the correct synonym. Using vocabulary from the Y5/6 Spelling List.

Greater Depth Match each word to the correct synonym. Using vocabulary from the Y5/6 Spelling List and a wider range of challenging vocabulary. A dictionary may be necessary to help with unfamiliar vocabulary.

Greater Depth Select and explain the most appropriate synonym needed to complete a given sentence. Using vocabulary from the Y5/6 Spelling List and a wider range of challenging vocabulary within a complex, multi-clause sentence. A dictionary may be necessary to help with unfamiliar vocabulary.

1. A. particular; B. surprise; C. plenty

3. Louise, because 'peculiar' implies odd. However, Isaac's word 'special' could also work, because 'special' implies unique. Accept either with given reasoning.

Expected

4. A. cheekily → mischievously; B. enough → sufficient; C. hopeful → desperate
5. immediate - 3; difficult - 1; familiar - 2
6. Gerald, because 'urged' implies persuasion. However, Kathleen's word 'begged' could also work, because 'begged' implies to accompany them. Accept either with given reasoning.

Greater Depth

7. A. spitefully → maliciously; B. sincerely → earnestly; C. fixated → preoccupied
8. eloquent - 3; apprehensive - 1; yield - 2
9. Joanne, because 'rigorous' implies that the accommodation would be cleaned very well, as does 'thorough'. However, Eddie's word 'extensive' could also work, because 'extensive' implies that every part of the accommodation would be cleaned. Accept either with given reasoning.
