Developing

1. A and C
2. A. overreact; B. rehydrate; C. overground
3. Freddie has included three words which use the prefixes 're-' and 'over-', but they have not all been used correctly. 'Overthink' and 'redesigning' are correct, however 'overdraft' should be 'redraft'.

Expected

4. B and C
5. A. overlook; B. react; C. overhaul
6. Fiona has included four words which use the 're-' or 'over-' prefix, not three. Overestimated and overtired use the 'over-' prefix correctly, however 'reride' should be 'override' and 'overassess' should be reassess.

Greater Depth

7. A and D
8. A. rejoin; B. relocate; C. overpowers
9. Ali has included three words which include the prefixes 're-' and 'over-', however one of them has been used incorrectly. 'Recomplicate' should use the prefix 'over-' and be written as 'overcomplicate'.
