Add Decimals with Different Numbers of Decimal Places

Developing

- 1 = B, 2 = C, 3 = A
- A is true; B is false, the answer is 5.47; C is true.
- Sinead is correct. Ben has added the 4 in the thousandths column instead of the tenths column.

Expected

- 1 = B, 2 = A, 3 = C
- A is true; B is false, the answer is 2.47; C is false, the answer is 5.402.
- Sean is correct. Steph has added the 3 in the thousandths column instead of the tenths column.

Greater Depth

- 1 = A, 2 = C, 3 = B
- A is true; B is true; C is false, the answer is 5.481.
- Hafsa is correct. Chuan has added the 1 in the hundredths column instead of the tenths column and the 8 in the thousandths column instead of the hundredths column.
